ANNE HATHAWAY

SHE IS A RISING STAR WITH A GENUINE LOVE OF LEARNING

At 21, Brooklyn-born actress Anne Hathaway—star of *Ella Enchanted*, *Havoc*, and *Princess Diaries 2*—has been juggling studies and acting most of her life.

"I love learning," she told Netscape's *Celebrity Online* magazine. "It's a gift to be at Vassar College where information and knowledge of such a high quality are there for the taking."

She became involved in theatre at a young age, and as a teenager performed with the prestigious New York theatre company, the Barrow Group.

As an English and Women's Studies major at Vassar, Hathaway has more often than not allowed her studies to take precedence over her acting career. As soon as *The Princess Diaries* was released, Hathaway was offered an array of enticing roles, but she chose the path to Vassar



instead. If she ever discontinues acting, she claims she would like to be an English professor or a psychologist. Her favorite college class so far has been American Politics. "It looked at U. S. history from the perspective of immigrants," she said.

In addition to her academic goals, Hathaway has aspirations for a Broadway career. In high school, she was the first soprano who had the privilege of performing at Carnegie Hall (twice) as a member of the All-Eastern U. S. High School Honors Chorus. For theatre, she studied at the Paper Mill Playhouse in New Jersey and at the inaugural pre-college summer program at the Collaborative Arts Project. She was nominat-



ed for the Paper Mill's "Rising Star Award" for the best high school performance by an actress in New Jersey.

Described as poised, well-spoken, and brainy, Hathaway is a rising star on the stage as well as in the classroom.

■ An intense and focused reader, Hathaway's favorite books are *Beloved* by Toni Morrison and *Bluebeard* by Kurt Vonnegut.

■ Her favorite movies are *All That Jazz*, *Pretty Woman*, *Beauty and the Beast*, and *Elizabeth*.

■ Anne Hathaway loves to cook, and her favorite place to shop is the grocery store.

■ She claims that the coolest person around is her brother, Tom, age 13. "He knows exactly who he is and what he wants and never apologizes for or stops being himself!"

■ Her big screen acting break came when she landed the role of Meghan Green on the Fox 1999 drama *Get Real*.

■ Lopez competed as a featherweight in the 2000 Olympics and as a welterweight in the 2004 Olympics.

His current 176-lb. weight is more natural for his 6-foot-2 frame. ■ Lopez, his brother, and two business partners developed a general fitness program called FIT 360 that incorporates aspects of yoga, pilates, Taekwondo, and other martial arts.

■ His heroes are Muhammad Ali and brother, Jean.

■ Steven's father encouraged his children to learn self-defense—all are now Taekwondo champions.

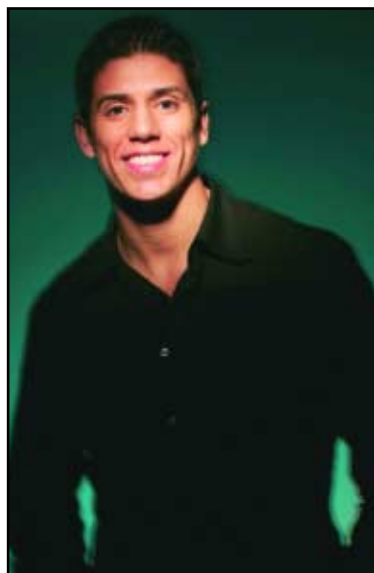
STEVEN LOPEZ

requirements and principles of Taekwondo have guided me for most of my life." Lopez began practicing Taekwondo in the family's makeshift gym—otherwise known as the garage—when he was just five years old. All three of his siblings—Jean, Mark, and Diane—are Taekwondo champions. Older brother, Jean, is also Steven's coach. Lopez's parents, Julio and Ondino, are



from Nicaragua, and for more than two decades, Taekwondo has been a way of life for their first-generation American family.

In addition to his exemplary athletic and academic career, Steven was named one of *People Magazine's* "50 Hottest Bachelors" in the June 2004 issue. The Olympic Champion claims he's too busy to date right now. When he isn't in training, he plays volleyball and basketball...and a little X-Box now and then, too.
